First Selectman Freda Announces North Haven Continues Stormwater Awareness Efforts

First Selectman Michael J. Freda announced today that North Haven is continuing with its Stormwater Awareness and Related Activities Program. As a part of this important environmental awareness program the Town during the weeks of June 29th and July 6th is again marking storm drains throughout Town. In conjunction with the United States Environmental Protection Agency and the State of Connecticut's Department of Energy and Environmental Protection MS4 Stormwater Best Management Program (BMP), the Town will be marking storm drains throughout Arthur Street, Bassett Road, Blakeslee Avenue, Bunker Hill Road, Cannonball Road, Carriage Drive, Center Brook Road, Charter Oak Place, Clintonville Road (State Route 22), Coach Drive, Corporate Drive, Cricket Court, Edison Drive, Elliot Court, Fallon Drive, Fawn Ridge Road, Flintlock Road, Goodwill Road, Heritage Hill Road, Howe Street, Independence Lane, Kenna Drive, Larson Drive, Larson Drive Extension, Revere Street, Manomet Avenue, Maple Avenue, Margo Circle, May Street, Musket Drive, Oakwood Drive, Orcutt Court, Priscilla Street, Revere Road, Roberta Avenue, Roger Avenue, Samoset Avenue, Sentinel Hill Road, Shawmut Avenue, St. John Street, Standish Avenue, Surrey Drive, Susan Lane, Tenedine Drive, Victor Road, William Street, and Wilson Avenue.

Catch basin markers stating "No Dumping, Drains to Stream" will be placed by Department of Public Works staff and college volunteers. North Haven, like many municipalities, is undertaking the storm drain marking project throughout the aforementioned neighborhoods to bring awareness to areas of sensitive waters where trash, nutrients (fertilizers) or pollutants have been identified.

The Department of Public Works will also be transmitting letters to Town residents of aforementioned streets where markers will be installed to enhance knowledge regarding stormwater management.

"The environment is a vital aspect of community that cannot be overlooked. What we are intending to do here is to not only improve the surroundings of North Haven but to assist in improving the overall global ecosystem. We appreciate the ongoing efforts of our residents to help us in achieving this goal", Selectman Freda stated.
